We cannot escape from the fury of natural disasters and manmade disaster but we could prevent and minimise the loss caused due to same. There have been plentiful occurrences of disasters throughout the ages. Disaster is negatively corelated with development activities as it slows down the process of development.

Calamities in the district vary from eastern to western part. The Eastern, Southern & Northern parts face flood / water logging almost every year. There is a long stretch of NH - 2 and rail network traversing through this district. Hence, there has always been possibility of occurrence of road or rail accidents, resulting in human suffering.

There has been a pragmatic change in the approach, methods and execution of relief operations during before and after natural calamities. Of late, there is a shift in paradigm in the management of flood and disaster from the earlier concept of contingent plan to comprehensive Disaster Risk Management Programme. It is more or less holistic in nature and involves all concerned departments, people's representatives and NGOs.

The Purba Bardhaman District successfully implemented DRMP from 2004 to 2009 in order to reduce the impact of disasters in a convergent and co-ordinated manner. The GOI-UNDP Disaster Risk Reduction Programme (DRR) has also been implemented from 2009 to March, 2013 in order to mitigate the risk factor of the disasters. It is also stressed that developmental works of different departments and Panchayat Raj Institutions should converge to fulfil some of the objectives of Disaster Risk Management Programme. Keeping the aforesaid issues in mind and for implementation of Disaster Management Act 2005, there was a felt need to have a well documented District Disaster Management multi hazards and Response Plan for our district. Relevant details in connection with disaster management, exercises have been incorporated in this booklet. The Disaster Management Plan will be the basis to establish policies and procedures for assuring maximum and efficient utilisation of all resources of the District with a view to minimize the loss of property, life and injury to the population.

The District Disaster Management Authority has been constituted in terms of sub-Sec.1 of Section 14 of the Disaster Management Act 2005. The present booklet reflects the activities of the Disaster Management Authority, Purba Bardhaman District in performing functions and achieving objectives as laid down in the Act. No major natural calamity, earthquake, flood etc. were reported in this District in the last year. The Disaster

Management Section, however, has undertaken various preparatory measures for tackling situation arising out of anticipated natural disasters. Training of staff, awareness programme at School, Colleges, Gram Sansads, procurement of equipments, imparting specialized skill in respect of deep diving etc. have been undertaken with active assistance of Department of Disaster Management & Civil Defence, Nabanna, Howrah -711102.

This year (2020) the threat of pandemic spread of Novel Corona Virus (COVID-19) has emerged. This district remains vigilant with all its officials in view of the impending apprehension of the spread of the virus and has taken immediate preventive activities to combat the epidemic.

We hope this booklet will serve as ready reckoner in the event of any disaster for real time communication of vital information in between the affected persons and the rescue, relief providers, District Administration etc. The steps enumerated in the booklet may help in reducing the damages to life and property of the affected population in the event of any disaster.

PURBA BARDHAMAN DISTRICT AT A GLANCE

Purba Bardhaman district was formed on O7.04.2017 after bifurcation of erstwhile Bardhaman district in 2 parts, Paschim Bardhaman, comprising of Asansol Sub-Division and Durgapur Sub-Division (except Galsi-I Dev. Block) and Purba Bardhaman compising of Sadar (North), Sadar (South), Kalna and Katwa Sub-Divisions. The name Burdwan is the anglicised form of Barddhaman. (also spelt as Burdwan or Burdhman).

There are two schools of thought about the name Barddhaman. It might have been named after the 24th Jaina Tirthankar. According to Kalpasutra of the Jains, Mahavira spent sometime in Astikagram which was formerly known as Barddhaman. According to the second school, Barddhaman means prosperous growth centre. In the progress of Aryanisation from Upper Ganges valley, the frontier colony was called Barddhaman as a landmark of growth and prosperity. The name came to stay as the Aryans failed to consolidate their gains further east.

The main towns of the district are Burdwan, Kalna & Katwa; Memari, Guskara and Dainhat are the smaller towns.

Geography: Total Geographical Area: 5432.69 sq. km.

The district extends from 22°56' to 23°53' N latitude and from 86°48' to 88°25' E longitudes. Lying within Burdwan Division, the district is bound on the north by Birbhum and Murshidabad, on the east by Nadia, on the south by Hooghly, Bankura and Purulia and on the west by Paschim Bardhaman districts.

RIVERS:

The river system in Purba Barddhaman includes the Bhagirathi-Hooghly in the east, the Ajoy and its tributaries in the north and the Dwarakeswar, the Damodar and its branches in the south-west. Besides, there are innumerable Khals and old river beds all over the area.

WATER RESOURCES:

There are many tanks, wells, canals, swamps and beels found all over the district. Within the Damodar Valley region, there are more than 17000 tanks.

FOREST:

The forest areas of the district are mainly situated in the lateritic and red soil high lands in the Ausgram PS of Sadar North Subdivision. In Ausgram P.S. the forest areas are interspersed with paddy fields.

FISHES:

The rivers and rivulets which pass through the district of Purba Bardhaman, the Ganges (Bhagirathi), the Damodar, the Banka, the Ajoy and the Khari constitute the fisheries of immense importance. Out of these rivers, only the Ganges maintains the flow of water throughout the year. The flow of Damodar depends entirely upon the discharge of water by DVC from its barrages. The other rivers practically dry up in hot months when fishes accumulate in depressions here and there to be caught seasonally by the fishermen.

CLIMATE:

The district experiences a climate which is as follows:

Average temperature in hot season is 30°C while at the cold season is 20°C. Average annual rainfall is 1417 milimeter.

The winter season starts from about the middle of November and continues till the end of February. March to May is dry summer intervened by tropical cyclones and storms which although infrequent out are notable features of the weather and climate of this district. June to September is wet summer while October and November is autumn.

AGRICULTURE:

On an average about 58 percent of the total population belongs to the agricultural population while the non-agricultural sector accounts for the remaining 42 percent.

The eastern, northern, southern and central areas of the district are extensively cultivated. Rice is the staple food of the district. Paddy covers maximum of the gross cropped area. Among commercial crops, jute, sugarcane, potato and oilseeds are major crops. Productivity of the major crops grown in the district is indicated below. Major cropping patterns include paddy-wheat-vegetables, paddy – potato – sesame, paddy – vegetable – mustard and jute – paddy – vegetables.

Due to climate condition, geographical location and industrial belt areas Purba Bardhaman district faces various disasters throughout the year. The major thrust is being given on 'flood' as it causes maximum damage of loss of property and human lives.

CHAPTER-I: INTRODUCTION: AIM, OBJECTIVES, STAKEHOLDERS THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES, EVALUATION OF LAST DDMP (PROCEDURE & METHODOLOGIES)

> Aim:

The District Disaster Management Plan is the outcome of the Disaster Management Act of 2005 wherein Section 25(I) of the plan it is mentioned about the formation of the District Disaster Management Authority and in Section 31(2) states the formation of the District Plan.

The District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) aims to reduce and avoid the protential losses from hazards. It is a consolidated guideline and plan of the District Disaster Management Section in collaboration with the line department in addressing disaster situations.

Disaster Management means a continuous and integrated process of planning, organising, coordinating and implementing measures which are necessary for minimising the losses of human lives, livelihoods and assets and assure promt and appropriate assistance to victims of disaster and achieve rapid and effective recovery.

Objectives:

- The purpose of this plan is to establish procedures for implementation prior to, during and following a natural or man-made disaster.
- The plan gives primary consideration to require actions necessary to protect the property, human lives, livestock etc.
- Mitigation or reduction of risk of any disaster or its severity or consequences,
- o Capacity Building among stake holders, community, PRI Bodies etc.
- o Preparedness to deal with any disaster.
- o Prompt response to any threatening disaster situation or disaster.
- Assessing the severity or magnitude of effects of any disaster.
- Evacuation, rescue and relief.
- Rehabilitation and reconstruction.
- o Develop more economic activities for creating more employment.

Onus of prevention and mitigation measures solely lies on this department. As it is natural calamity, so it could not be prevented but degree of damage /loss may be minimized by proper management. In case of flood due to excessive rainfall ,the rain gauge stations at concerned stations are properly monitored and probable discharge through flood routing is communicated to all concern before hand in order to shift the vulnerable at safer places. The areas which will be submerged are identified for evacuation along with danger levels of the rivers to be communicated to all concern at real time basis. Moreover these datas are broadcasted by Social media, Television, Radio etc. for wide coverage. The embankments/banks of rivers are to be properly maintained to avert any breach type situation and close vigil is kept during flood discharge on the health of embankment. Regarding prevention and mitigation measure, Deptt identify the vulnerable zones of embankments and status of congestion of drainage channels after monsoon, take necessary action to repair them before next monsoon. Authorities are also directed to fix up the water level of reservoir as per guide curve of the reservoirs to mitigate the flood disaster affect due to excessive rainfall. Regarding reconstruction, rehabilitation and recovery measures, the damaged portion of the embankments, bridges, canals are identified after the recession of flood water and restoration works are taken up immediately and completed before the next disaster at the same monsoon. Irrigation and Waterways Department is entrusted with the task of providing irrigation facilities, offering reasonable protection against flood, alleviating drainage congestion, arresting erosion, maintaining internal navigation channels and up-keeping the natural waterways.

CHAPTER-3: INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR DISASTER MANAGEMENT: GP, BLOCK, MUNICIPALITIES AND COMMUNITY LEVEL DM STRUCTURE, IRS, EOC SET-UP

Gram Panchayat Level:

The Gram Panchayat Pradhan along with their employees especially the Executive Assistant & Nirman Sahayak, guided by the Block Levele Lianson Officer will monitor, supervise and control the Disaster Management Works during the period of incidents

Block Level:

At Block Level Panchayat Samiti members including Office Bearers and Block Level different Officers will do the job for the disaster management. The Block Level Team consists of following members:



At Muncipality Level: The Chairman of the Municipality, all the Councillors of the Wards alongwith Executive Officers and technical staff will be responsibole for monitoring the disaster situation and manage it under direct supervision of the SDO concerned.

Community level: All the members of Gram Panchayat at community level will be informed and they in turn will educate people at grass-root level and give feedback to the block level for taking up desired plan of action as necessary.

IRS (Incedent Response System): The complexity of incident management coupled with the need for multi-agency and multi-functional involvement on incidents was the main rationale for the development of a single standard incident management system that can be used by all emergency response disciplines. This need resulted in the development and implementation of Incident Command System (ICS).

A. Moreover the following activities will be done for mitigation measures.

- i) Awareness: Awareness generation will be done through meeting, poster, flex, and booklet. In this regard DMCD has printed a calender which is distributed through blocks. District Disaster Management Section of this district also has attended in different mela, organised at different blocks for awareness generation.
- ii) DM Plan: DM plan has been prepared by all the blocks, Sub-Divisions, line Departments to prevent and mitigate disasters.
- iii) Visit of embankment: Visit of embankment will be done jointly by Irrgation Department local Panchayat Samity and Blocks and mitigation measures will be taken where necessary during pre monsoon.
- iv) Visit of Relief Godown: It will be done by all the blocks & Sub-Divisions and they will prepare the list of old godowns where renovation is required and fund will be sought for from dept of DMCD for both new & old.
- v) Visit of Flood Shelter: It will be done by all the blocks & Sub-Divisions and they will prepare the list of old flood shelter where renovation is required and fund will be sought for from dept of DMCD for both new & old.
- vi) Training of CDVs: Training of CDVs are going on in evey month where necessary.
- vii) Training at community level awareness programme will be done by the blocks.

CHAPTER - 5: PREPAREDNESS MEASURES: EARLY WARNING, QRT, OPERATION OF EOC, GIS BASED DATA, MOCK DRILL COMMUNITY PREPAREDNESS ETC.

A. EARLY WARNING:

For disaster response in the District, Control room remains opened at District Disaster Management Section (District EOC) on and from 1st June to 31st October each year for 24X7 hours having Phone No. 0342-2665092, email: ocprbdn.civdef-wb@gov.in apart from the Sub-Divisional & Block control room which will be opened as and when required as per emergency need.

Pre monsoon preparatory meeting will be held at district level in the month of May at the District Headquarters.

Control Room will also be opened at SDO & BDO offices as first hand information dissemination system from the affected villages & GPs.


Heavy rainfall with thunderstorm message will be directly disseminated from State EOC to the concerned GP Prodhans, SDDMOs & DDMO. It will also be communicated to the BDMOs concerned.

FORECASTING AND WARNING AGENCIES

Website of IMD, Kolkata for daily weather report will be checked by the district everyday and sent through FAX, email, and SMS to all concerned. District EOC will also keep close contact with the State EOC about the weather condition in the District and State in the monsoon period. Information received from the State is then disseminated to the Block and the Gram panchayat through respective Blocks & GP offices. Information dissemination is also collected from line department after / during monsoon season during the release of water from the DVC dam which may cause flood to the adjacent villages to the rivers. This practice has been started since year 2019.

During monsoon season there is daily update of the report from District to State EOC.

B. QRT:

At District Head Qtr. QRT with the Civil Defence Volunteers have been framed as mentioned below. It is needless to mention here that there are 2 (two) QRT Van, one small & one big, within which rescue equipments are kept for use as and when required. The following arrangemens are made from the months of June to October.

C. Operation of EOC:

District EOC is operating 24 X 7 through office phone no. 0342-2665092 as and when required. Close contact is being kept with State EOC through toll free no 1070.

D. Mock Drill, Community preparedness etc. :

Community preparedness through exhaustive training programme throughout 23 Blocks, 6 Municipalities will be done from January to December every year for which a training calender will be prepared. Mock drill on flood, drowning will also be conducted during a suitable time. It is mentioned here that apart from above, training / awareness programme are being conducted by BDMOs with trained CDVs at many blocks. Documentation of the above training are being preserved for submission to the Department.

CHAPTER - 6: CAPACITY BUILDING & TRAINING MEASURES : APPROACH, ANNUAL TRAINING PLAN & BUDGET.

Community capacity building and community based disaster management :-

This includes training of vulnerable community on the resilient society building. The activities would be organised by the block Disaster Management Section which would include community awareness on disaster, mitigation and awareness on early warning, resilient house building, embankment protection and drinking water safety measures. Communities are also sensitized on safe house building, sanitation, use and ways to get safe drinking water in the community.

Civil Defence Volunteers.

The Civil Defence Volunteers are trained time to time by Civil Defence Section on providing First Aid to the wounded, artificial respiration, emergcy method of rescue, bandage, knot and stretcher. They will be used as protential human resources in time of any disaster for quick reponse to the affected and at the same time will be used for control of the District EOC and relief distribution and loading and unloading of relief materials. The Civil Defence volunteers are also trained on divers' programme. At present there are 15 Nos. of trained deep divers available in the district Civil Defence Section, Purba bardhaman upto December, 2019. Availability of total basic trained CD volunteers in the district is 3533 as on December'19.

Upto December, 2019 Total 74 Trainining on Awarness programme & Capacity Building on Disaster Management have been done at different Blocks & Muncipalities under Purba Bardhaman District.

Moreover a tentative training programme on different topics of Disaster Management under different Blocks are appended below.

Moreover the SDDMOs & BDMOs from the district are regularly sent to ATIs for reviewing and updating their knowledge on DM and mitigation as per the changing norms of the deptt's. needs and for practical implementation at the field level. These training are done at Govt. organisation and Non Govt. ofganisaton collaboration. Based on the HVRCA evaluation is being made to identify the crisis and plan mitigation programmes to reduce disaster.

Community level institutions (PRI, Blocks, Schools and Hospital) are sensitized by the programmes organised by the Block Disaster Management Section at various occasions and through IEC materials and booklets. Muncipalities conduct regular awareness programmes on heal th issues and hygiene among the wards.

CHAPTER - 7: RESPONSE AND RELIEF MEASURES.

Disaster response is the second phase of the disaster management cycle. It consists of a number of elements, for example; warning/evacuation, search and rescue, providing immediate assistance, assessing damage, continuing assistance and the immediate restoration or construction of infrastructure. The aim of emergency response is to provide immediate assistance to maintain life, improve health and support the morale of the affected population. Such assistance may range from providing specific but limited aid, such as assisting refugees with transport, temporary shelter and food, to establishing semi-permanent settlement in camps and other locations. It also may involve initial repairs to damage or diversion to infrastructure.

The focus in the response phase is on putting people safe, need to prevent disasters and meeting the basic needs of the people until more permanent and sustainable solutions can be found.

A. Disaster Management Section:

The blocks are well equipped with the resources and inventories to address any disaster situation in the blocks. For any major disaster situation for which external help is needed the State will coordinate with the Central govt. for assistance or help and relief measures. This would be done in coordination of the Principal Secretary and Joint Secreatry of the State. The coordination for support or external help would also include report from blocks forwarded by the SDO to the DM of the District.

The first assessment report would be prepared by the block in CA-II form in coordination with the Panchayat based on HVCRA format. This would incude the nature of disaster, loss of property, loss of human life, infrastructure loss and the support of needs to be provided. This would be done by the damage assessment team prepared in the block. BDMO will monitor the findings and take necessary steps in coordination of BDO, SDO and Department of Disaster Managemen and Civil Defence.

The blocks are pre stocked with relief items which includes tarpaulin, clothing, food grains etc. Based on the findings of the assessment report, the relief items would be distributed among the affected community. Line deptt. of the Govt. will also arrange for the pre stocking of materials which includes requirement of bleaching powder, Halogen tablet, ORS packet, normal saline, AVS by the Deptt. of Health. The Dept. of Food & Supply allots special ration allotment in the affected areas with food grains & kerosene oil. PWD, PHE, Electric supply will do all necessary restoration of damage assets in the community, whereas based on the damage assessment report of Horticulture dept., ARD and Agriculture would provide seeds, fodders for restoration of livelihood in the areas.

DEPARTMENT OF ARD:

Arrangement for procurement and storage of essential inputs i.e medicines, vaccines disinfectants, drinking water etc,. have been made to save the affected livestock.

They Will keep reserve stock of paddy straw and concentrated feed respectively for anticipated calamity, if any.

HORTICULTURE:

The deptt. of Horticulture will arrange and keep ready seeds for distribution and pre stock of seeds for the distribution among the affected farmers and communities. These include seeds like vindi, cucumbers, brinjal, chilli, palak, radish, cauliflower, cabbage, tomato, brinjal etc.

Public Health Engineering:

The PHE Division arranges and mitigates disaster situation. The deptt. has their vulnerability assessment of the area and has pre stocking of the stocks for immediate use after any disaster. This includes preparedness pre disaster, duing disaster and post disaster for mitigation work.

FISHERIES:

The department has their vulnerabaility assessment of the area affected and makes damage assessment or loss to the fishery. The same is incorporated to the damage assessment report. The Dept. arranges for boats and coordinates with the relief distribution in flood affected areas. The deptt. arranges for supply of fishes in the affected communities.

WBSEDCL:

Deptt. of electricity / Deptt. of WBSEDCL openes 24 X 7 controll room for addressing disaster in the district. Alongwith this, pre stocking of essential items are made for addressing any power failure in the district/ blocks. The Dept. also arranges for quick response van with sufficient manpower at all customer care centre and HT mobile vans with sufficient manpower at all 33/11 KV sub-station are engaged for day to day work and also meet up the emergency situation.

IRRIGATION & WATERWAYS:

Deptt. of Irrigation conducts cleaning the water hyacinth in the different khals where necessary. Cleaning and maintainance of sluice gates will be done.

DISTRICT DISASTER MANAGEMENT SECTION:

The relief reconstruction, rehabilitation and recovery measures of the district would be monitored by the Directorate of the respective departments involved. District Magistrate would provide guidelines on the type of assistance should be provided and the quantity.

The reconstruction, rehabilitation and recovery measures of the district would be done based on the findings of the damage assessment team in the affected blocks, GP and Panchayat. This would be based on the findings and needs of the community. The line departments of the Govt. would be responsible for the restoration of the livelihood and the infrastructure of the community.

CHAPTER-8: RECONSTRUCTION, REHABILITATION AND RECOVERY MEASURES

Reconstruction: Steps will be taken to reconstruct the damaged properties with immediate effect through available Government fundings of GP, Block & Districts to regularize the situation after the disaster. In case of flood like situation Drinking Water facilities will be disinfected very soon to protect the human life. Agricultural and Live stock losses will be assessed without delay to mitigate the owners with insurance and Government aids.

Rehabilitation: The people who left their houses to save their life will be rehabilitated after due care of their houses. Government aids will be provided to them to cope up the situation. Starvation Gratutious Relief may also provided to them for their daily foodings.

Recovery: Recovery of the human life during disaster and after the disaster from their distress condition will be taken care off. The Gram Panchayat functionaries will provide close vigil on the health, nutrition and livelihood. They will be provided priority in respect of appropriate Government Schemes after the disaster. A thorough micro plan to make their life normal will be prepared by the Gram Panchayat with the help of Block for taking immediate measures.

The Department of Disaster Management would provide essential services to the community. These includes:

- ❖ Special GR (Rice)
- ❖ Normal GR (Wheat)
- ❖ Cash GR (Starvation)
- ❖ Cash GR (NC)
- ❖ Tarpaulin for shelter
- ❖ ER Grant (Economic rehabilitation) grant for financially unstable communities (General & Ex TB patients) to start new livelihood options.
- ❖ Provision for distribution of cloth, garments, blankets, male wrapper and DM kit.

For construction of the houses which are damaged, the provision of HB Grant (Fire/NC) allotment is made. The grant is subject to communities economically unstable and under financial constrain. Recommendation & assessment report would assess the amount to be sanctioned as per the damage report. Vulnerable communities are given main focus for the scheme.

The line departments of the Govt. would be responsible for restoration of the livelihood and infrastructure of the community.

- i) PHE would provide drinking water and sanitation facility to community.
- ii) Health department would monitor the health condition.
- iii) Agriculture, Horticulture and Animal husbandry department would be responsible for the restoration of the livelihood of the community and providing support. This activity can also be long drawn by the report of NGO's through respective programme.

The damage assessment would also formulate the need for intervention for long term & short term relief measures. The respective line departments would formulate plan & programmes as per need of the community.

Those are as follows:

- Training of SGH groups on alternative livelihood and Natural Resources Management like season nursery raising, manure production by Agriculture department
- ❖ Training of farmers' club on rice intensification techniques, saline, variety paddy cultivation of agriculture department by agriculture and horticulture department.
- ❖ Awareness generation on different alternative livelihood govt. schemes like embroidery mobile technologies GO block level.
- ❖ Raised platform as evacuation points under MGNREGS
- * Repairing of roads, channels clearing activities under MGNREGS.
- * Repairing of embankments with piling process under MGNERGS.
- ❖ Pond renovation and land shaping activities for IBS and beneficiaries by MGNREGS.
- Road side plantation / household plantation schemes from Panchayat / Agriculture department.

Long term programmes:

- ❖ Strengthening of vulnerable embankments by Irrigation Department
- ❖ Water testing / disinfection of tube wells by official of PHE
- ❖ Training of water user group repairing of tube wells by PHE / block
- Installation of temporary tube wells in flood prone areas by GP / block / PHE
- ❖ Installation of temporary community latrines by block / TSC/ NBA

Non Structural:

- Mason / Carpenter / Engineer training construction pattern by MGNRGS / IAY (RGAY)
- ❖ Training on tube well repairing by PHE / block
- Training on sanitary mart under NBA
- Construction of DRR shelter under IAY (RGAY)
- Construction of tube wells with raised platform by PHE / Block/ GP
- Construction of cyclone and flood shelter under NCRMP / PMNRF

Livelihood activities:

- ❖ (Structural) New concrete road construction by PWD / Block/ PMGSY
- Mangrove plantation in approach / embankment under MGNREGS / GP/ block/ Agriculture department.
- Cannel clearing and installation of sluice gates by irrigation dept.
- Maintenance of roads and building of new roads under PWD.
- ❖ Involvement of SHG in schools in MDM programmes under Department of Education.

CHAPTER - 9: FINANCIAL RESOURCES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF DDMP: STATE BUDGET, MITIGATION FUND, RISK INSURANCE.

The fund for the District Disaster Management Section is provided as and when required from the Department of Disaster Management & Civil Defence, Nabanna.

These fund includes:

- ♦ House Building grant (both NC & fire)
- ❖ ER Grant (both General & Ex TB patients)
- ❖ Ex Gratia Grant fund for death of persons (snake bite, lightening & accidental fire etc.), Fund are sanctioned by NDRF/SDRF (fund in the district).
- ❖ For any damage (due to flood / cyclone etc.) restoration funds are provided by DMCD for line department as well as District Disaster Management Section.
- Contingency fund to incur different payments related to Disaster Management.
- ❖ Besides these the State Govt. sanctioned funds for the generation of awareness programmes in the blocks, alongwith the funds to conduct mock drills. These funds are used for mitigation of disaster in the community and at the same time generation of awareness among the community on disaster and mitigation measures.
- * Respective line departments also use their fund for the implementation of DRR activities in the block through their regular programme.
- ❖ Fund are also being used for construction of flood shelter as well as relief godown.

CHAPTER-10: Procedure And Methodology For Monitoring, Evaluation, Updation And Maintenance of DDMP.

The block would review the BDM plan annually and submit the same to the District Disaster Management Section under Section 31 (4). The District Disaster Management Department would compile the same along with the Disaster Management Plan of the line departments of the Govt. and formulate the DDMP.

Monitoring: The Disaster Management Plan will be monitored closely during the period of disaster. If any discrepancy/ difficulties found, it will be noted down for future reference. The village level stake holdres' view also to be incorporated in the plan, because they are the primary stake holdres of the incident.

Evaluation: After each and every occurance plan will be evaluated by the Block Level Monitoring Committee. SWOT analysis of the plan will be also be taken care off. Weakness and Threat of the Plan will be tried to minimize by resource input available.

Updation: Plan will be updated time to time to make it more and more effective and error free. The aim of updation of plan is to make the plan fit for every incident under the jurisdiction of the Block.

Maintenance: The plan will be maintained in a dynamic manner rather make it a static bunch of papers. All the findings will be analysed in view of the situation and decision evaluated will be incorporated in the plan with due care. The need of the affected people will be given top priority during maintenance of the plan.

Post disaster evaluation mechanism for DDMP would be done by the respective Block Disaster Management Section and the line department of the Govt. respectively. Based on the plans submitted by them the recovery and relief measures would take place.

Schedule for updation of DDMP:

Regular updating process of the DDMP, reflecting section that needs updation at various intervals as per need and changes in the communication & mitigation plan under Section 31 (7)

One plan is submitted by the District under Section 31 (6) as directed. It would be uploaded to the web site of the department for reference and use and also for the reference of the common people.

Conducting mock drills at district and sub-division level, at least annually, is important for the district as per approved mock drill calendar. It would ensure that all should understand their roles and responsibility clearly and understand the needs of the vulnerable groups involving them in actual exercise. It would also help to test the efficacy of the plans prepared. Based on feedback from such exercise, the plans will

have to be revised and capacity would be enhanced to fill up the gaps. While indicating the mock drill plan of action, it is essential to list down the following.

- ❖ The Sub-Division Disaster Management Section and the Block Disaster Management Section would conduct training and awareness programme in the blocks as per the guidelines of the DMCD. This would be based on the schedules prepared by the blocks in coordination with the line departments participating in the mock drill exercise. Respective department will arrange for the necessary equipments needed for organising the training and mcok drill in the block.
- ❖ Training and updation of knowledge is provided by the ATI to the DDMO, SDDO, BDMO on regular process to formulate and monitor the plans of the district. Training are provided on a regular basis to familiarize one with the changing trends in disaster mitigation and planning in the state and block level based on the DDMP and national guidelines.

CHAPTER -11: COORDINATION MECHANISM FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF DDMP.

The District Disaster Management Section will co-ordinate and monitor the DDMP in co-ordination of the line Departments of the District.

Co-ordination would be done by the Departments in consultation with the contact numbers of the respective Departments and via official letters and e mails.

Respective BDMOs of the Block would co-ordinate and follow up activities and linkage with the task force of civil defence team and co-ordinate with villages during and pre disaster situation.

As per section 41 of DM Act 2005, local authorities will co-ordinate and formulate for implementation of the Plan in the District. Blocks and local PRI will co-ordinate and implement the DDMP in the Block. The local authority also plays a vital role in time of relief distribution and co-ordinate for implementation of relief programme. Local authority also take active role in carcass disposal. The Additional District Magistrate, OC Disaster Management, DDMO would be the authorised persons to coordinate and monitor the recovery programme in the district along with SDDMOs & BDMOs.

During management of any disaster, support from neighbouring district may be sought for. For this SDMA and concerned departments of the State will provide necessary direction. Neighbouring district may provide, if required like boats, earth moving equipments, ambulances, dry foods like Chira & Gur, baby foods etc. There will also be a co-ordination with inter districts during release of flood water from the dams by DVC authority & Irrigation Department.

CHAPTER -12: STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES (SOPS) AND CHECKLIST.

SOPs and checklists could be prepared for various stakeholders effective response. These can be made based on the functioning of Emergency Support Function groups or IRS. Depending on the hazard profile and level of exposure the district should decide in a participatory way the number of ESF covering all the above. The SOPs would briefly describe the following:

Novel Corona Virus (COVID 19) Control and Prevention Plan District Level Committees

The following teams are constituted for containment, control and prevention of Novel Corona Virus (COVID 19) in the district and the following steps to be taken to control COVID 19. The respective committee may co-opt the officers necessary for carrying out the activities and compiling the reports. They shall ensure that the specific activities are conducted, data collected and presented in specific format in the checklist attached and submit the same to the State Control Room. The following teams should work independently with their respective teams under the direct supervision of District Magistrate, Purba Bardhaman.

District Level Corona Virus Control Teams

- 1. Coordination with line Departments, Documentation, Finance Management Committee.
- 2. Surveillance, Control Room Management, Sample Tracing, Data Management Committee
- 3. Human Resource Management, Trainings, Material Management Committee
- 4. Transportation and Ambulance Management, Expert Study Coordination, Infrastructure Management (Isolation Ward and Facilities) Committee
- 5. Media Surveillance, IEC & Awareness Generation Committee
- 6. Community Level Volunteer Coordination, Psychological support Committee Scope /Activities of various teams

1 Line Department Coordination

1. Line Department Coordination, Documentation, Finance Management Committee

a) Line Department Coordination Team

- i) This is the most important committee which will work under direct supervision of the District Magistrate.
- ii) There should be regular coordination between Health Department and all line departments such as School Education, Higher Education, Women & Child Welfare, Endowments, Private Hospitals, Nursing Homes, Drugs Control Administration,
 - Youth Affairs, Panchayatiraj Institutions, Animal Husbandry, Tourism, Police, Social Welfare, Minorities Welfare etc.

b) **Documentation Management**

- i) All the minutes of the meeting related to COVID 19 are to be documented
- ii) Proper communication of all decisions taken in the meetings are to be ensured
- iii) Proper communication to various teams of control room regarding meetings, guidelines, SOPs etc.
- iv) Compilation of activity reports by various teams regularly

c) Finance Management

- i) The district team for finance should discuss and foresee various areas of fund requirement and pool resources for all possible needs arising from time to time.
- ii) The decision regarding fund expenditure should be prepared timely and all the measures should be kept in place for smooth flow of funds.

2. Surveillance, Control Room Management, Sample tracing, Data Management Committee Surveillance

a) Hospital surveillance

- The condition of symptomatic patients admitted at isolation wards of hospitals will be closely scrutinized and reports will be sent to surveillance team
- ii) Analysis of reports

b) Private hospital surveillance team

- i) Team will compile the data regarding the general public visiting private hospitals in the district and identify any missed-out contacts of suspect cases reaching private facilities
- ii) Good rapport should be ensured with the private hospitals/associations

c) Field surveillance

- i) Those patients discharged from hospitals will be monitored by field workers (ASHA, ANM etc) in their corresponding PHC area.
- ii) Asymptomatic travellers /contacts in home isolation will also be monitored for 28 days by field workers and report will be sent to State Cell through BMOH and CMOH.

d) Lab Surveillance

- i) The District nodal officers entrusted for sample collection will inform the lab surveillance team before sample collection
- ii) Sample requisition forms will be scrutinized before sending to Virology Lab/ Testing Lab
- iii) Liaison with districts and sample collection point
- iv) Preparation of guidelines for Surveillance and Management of COVID-19 infection
- v) Support and supervision of surveillance activities at district level
- e) **Control Room Management Team:** Control room call center should be set up in district. The call center should be setup with mobile / landline telephone facility.

Mandates for Call Centre

- i) Maintenance of discipline
- ii) Time Management
- iii) Control Room will be operational 24X7
- iv) Documentation of all the activities happening in Call Centre
- v) Daily consolidation of report at 4:30 p.m.
- vi) To answer medical queries, logistics, and administrative issues regarding health and health related problems

f) Sample Tracing Team

- i) The team should keep a watch on sample sent to lab from the districts and answer all queries regarding the sending of samples in coordination with the public health labs.
- ii) The team should hand hold the district in transportation of samples, filling formats, collecting reports and intimate the authorities regarding the status of results, monitor and facilitate sample collection.
- iii) All sample test results to be reported to the Superintendent of Police, District Magistrate, CMOH etc. on daily basis

g) Data Management

- 1) The technical support of the DIO should be utilized for the same.
- ii) For all these parameters, district profile sheets with auto consolidated compilation sheets should be made.
- iii) The sheets should be dynamic and compilation should be given access to all the District and State team leaders.

3. Human Resource Management, Trainings, Material Management Committee

4. a) Human Resource Management

i) Human resource management taken at district level but at any point if district needs any additional support, the needs can be communicated to state

- ii) The team should have a thorough knowledge of all district Human Resource distribution
- iii) The team should also communicate the district regarding the optimum redistribution policies according to the needs
- iv) Management of Human Resource at isolation facilities and support from State Control Room can be taken for timely decisions, if necessary. Human Resource data of isolation facilities / nodal centers should be compiled on daily basis and ensure there is no shortage in any category

b) Trainings

- i) District will train all necessary cohort timely
- ii) District Level training will be done between 11th To 13th March 2020.
- iii) The data should be compiled and shared with State in the required format
- iv) The training materials will be disseminated by control room mail ID to all concerned, agencies, groups etc.
- v) Training to Control Room duty staff

c) Material Management Team

i) Material management should be done at the institution level using all possible resources under the control of Superintendent. However, there might be higher degree of needs arising in certain situations, these needs and activities should be compiled in the District and coordinated with State team. The District team is expected to compile the activities and challenges on day to day basis and submit to the State.

The primary responsibility of the material management team is:

- i) Prepare the list of items required at hospital for providing health care
- ii) Monitor inventory position institution wise
- iii) Ensure supply chain management of healthcare and other items requirement

4. Transportation and Ambulance Management, Expert Study Coordination, Infrastructure

a) Transportation and Ambulance Engagement team

i) The team should compile the data regarding the availability, spacing, training of ambulances drivers and vehicles carrying patients from home isolation to the hospital isolation facilities and back. It should be ensured that there should be continuous availability of vehicles in all districts.

c) Infrastructure Management - Isolation ward and facilities

- i) Identification of isolation places in district for at least for 50 patients
- ii) All required things in the isolation ward of these facilities to be ensured
- iii) Set-up dedicated team in the district
- iv) Training of the dedicated team and other health functionaries
- v) Strict protocol of infection control is to be followed in the district
- vi) Verification and compilation of the needs of additional isolation places if the number of cases is increasing in the district
- vii) The data should be collected in the prescribed format at the District level and submitted to the State.

5. Media Surveillance, IEC & Awareness Generation Committee

a) Media Surveillance team

i) Print, visual and social media surveillance with the support of district team.

- ii) Collection of information regarding demand and supply of logistics, Human Resource etc. circulated in the media, and addressing the needs by bridging the gaps after validating the information.
- iii) Reply queries to the general public regarding health-related events and information through phone numbers circulated at state level.
- iv) District level compilation of Media surveillance data should also happen regularly.

b) IEC Awareness generation

i) Dissemination of prepared IEC materials including audio visual aids / training materials to health workers / volunteers / public / media.

6. Community level volunteer coordination, Psychological support Committee a) Community level volunteer coordination team

- i) The field level activity monitoring should be done by this team.
- ii) Grass-root level support including food kit management when more people are at quarantine should also be done with the help of SHGs and Panchayats / Municipalities should review these activities and gaps on daily basis and present it to control room meeting.
- iii) Collect information of contacts and addresses.
- iv) Prepare the food kits to provide to the Contacts in Home Quarantine.

b) Psychological support team

i) Team should arrange district / field team for managing post-traumatic stress related events and stress during quarantine. The field level activities should be compiled and presented during daily Video Conference meeting.

c) Social distancing during the period of Natural Calamity:

The existing Flood Shelters can be used for accommodating the evacuated, rescued people by maintaining social distancing norms in case of natural calamity during the time of COVID 19. In this context a guideline of the Principal Secretary to the Government of West Bengal, Department of Disaster Management & Civil Defence, vide his no. 109-PSDM&CD/2020, dated 21.04.2020 should be followed

Some Activities of Purba Bardhaman District for containment of COVID 19:

- 1) 6 March, 2020: 1st Meeting of District Administration on prevention of COVID 19 with all district level officers and BDOs was held on 6th March, 2020 evening just after the video conference of Hon'ble Chief Minister. A dedicated district helpline no. (0342) 2665092 was opened.
- 2) 7 March, 2020: Sensitization camps with the ICDS, ASHA workers, Samprasaraks of Sishu Siksha Kendra, Madhyamik Siksha Kendra and other field level staffs were started from 7th March, 2020.
 - Flex banners and paper posters on COVID 19 awareness were printed overnight and supplied to the BDOs from the district head quarter. Those were displayed at the prominent locations of the district.
- 3) 8 March, 2020: On women's day the focus of celebration was on Awareness on Novel Corona Virus. The participants in the programme were given awareness materials.
- 4) Isolation wards became functional in Government Hospitals of the district from 7 March, 2020 onwards.

- 5) 12 March, 2020 Municipal and Block administration started organizing series of awareness camps at the respective areas. Katwa Municipality started house to house campaign with the municipal health workers.
- 6) 14 March, 2020: Wearing masks was made mandatory for the health workers on duty at district hospitals and health centres.
- 7) 15 March, 2020: As per directives of the state government, schools were closed til 31st March, 2020. Burdwan University also decided to close all its departments and the colleges.
- 8) 16 March, 2020: A Coordination Meeting with the district officials was held on 16th March, 2020. A 138 bed isolation unit at the under construction "Krishi Bhavan" at Burdwan-I Block was made functional from 16th March, 2020. It was decided that a Corona help desk would start functioning from 17th March, 2020 at Bardhaman, Katwa and Kalna Railway Station.
- 9) Special security and safety measures were taken up at Bardhaman Central Correctional home for its inmates to curb chances of spreading novel corona virus among them.
- 10) Bardhaman District Sports Association and Burdwan University cancelled all of their scheduled competitions, camps, league matches till 31st March, 2020 to prevent outbreak of COVID 19.
- 11) 17 March, 2020: Surveillance teams started functioning at different market area to creat awareness about social distancing in market places.
- 12) SP, Purba Bardhaman visited the spot of "Agradwip Gopinath Mela" under Katwa-II Block. This fair is being held at the end of March for the last 432 years. Lakhs of devotees come to this religious gathering. He hold talks with organizers about huge footfalls in the wake of spreading the corona outbreak.
- 13) Hostels of university, colleges and schools were vacated.
- 14) A resident of Ramnagar village under Ausgram-I Block returned from Pune with symptoms of high fever. He was admitted to the isolation ward of Burdwan Medical College & Hospital.
- 15) 18 March, 2020: "Agradwip Gopinath Mela" under Katwa-II Block cancelled by the organizer this year.
- 16) District administration along with Purba Bardhaman Zilla Parishad started awareness programmes in all the 215 gram panchayats of the district. Leaflets in Alchiki script was printed by the Zilla Parishad.
- 17) Meeting with sweet shop owners of Saktigarh under Burdwan-II Block was held at Pathasathi to make them aware and follow certain protocols jointly with health and police services.
- 18) Archaeological Survey of India closed all its monuments at Kalna from 17th March, 2020.
- 19) Fever clinic started functioning at Kalna Sub-divisional Hospital from 17th March, 2020.
- 20) Bardhaman and Katwa Municipalities closed the children parks from 17th March, 2020 to stop public gathering.
- 21) 19 March, 2020: Task force on preparedness and awareness generation were formed at the block level and coordination meetings were held.
- 22) 20 March, 2020: Gram Panchayat level awareness programme at Sankhai Ferry Ghat under Ketugram-II Block was held. A separate outdoor clinic for flu patients opened on 20th March, 2020.
- 23) 21 March, 2020: Rice and potato were distributed among the guardians of the students of primary schools, MSKs and SSKs from 21st March, 2020.
- 24) House to house visit was started by the BDOs, CDPOs, Medical Officers of BMOH and Panchayat Samity Members regarding COVID 19.

- 25) Self Help Groups were encouraged to prepare hand sanitizers.
- 26) District Administration held a meeting 20th March, 2020 with 14 private nursing homes of Purba Bardhaman regarding formation of isolation of wards. It was decided that local clubs, Anganwadi Workers, Civic Volunteers would be encouraged to monitor home quarantine persons.
- 27) Roadside Hoardings, carrying messages on novel corona virus awareness were installed at 10 important locations of the district.
- 28) One person was arrested by the district police and was given 12 days of Jail custody for spreading fake news on COVID 19 infection in social media.
- 29) Additional Chief Secretary, Sri Sunil Gupta held a coordination meeting in the district on 21st March, 2020.
- 30) Police personnel conducted visits at market areas throughout the district to prevent hoarding and black marketing.
- 31) Hand sanitizer was given to the students of Higher Secondary Examination Centre at Purbasthali-I Block on 21st March, 2020.
- 32) Health checks up of Railway passengers at Mashagram Station on 21st March, 2020.
- 33) Medical check up was done at Ketugram BPHC under surveillance of QRT of Ketugram-II Block for 57 persons returned from Brindaban dham No symptom was found. They were advised for self quarantine for next 14 days.
- 34) A special committee was formed by the Katwa Municipality to conduct house to house survey. The committee indentified the persons who have returned from other states in last couple of weeks. Thermal screening at Bardhaman Railway Station for passengers coming from other states done on 21st March, 2020.
- 35) 23 March, 2020: Complete safety measures were taken up across the state from 23rd March, 2020. Around 400 temporary hoarding regarding said measures were installed at government establishments throughout the district. Miking was done all over the district to inform the people about the protocols of complete safety measures.
- 36) SDO, Katwa held a Sub-division level meeting on preparedness of COVID 19 prevention.
- 37) Protocols of complete safety measures were published in district level news papers on 22nd March, 2020.
- 38) A district level coordination meeting was held on 23rd March, 2020. Complete safety measures were extended in Memari and Guskara Municipal areas.
- 39) One person was arrested at Kusumgram for black marketing of masks.
- 40) Distribution of PDS commodities was done observing WHO recommended guidelines to the extent possible.
- 41) 26 March, 2020: Awareness and Notice serving to the Grocery shops in Burdwan Municipality, Memari Municipality and Rasulpur village were done regarding safe distance maintenance in the recent situation of COVID 19 outbreak.
- 42) Two persons were arrested at Ausgram by police for hoarding and black marketing of essential commodities.
- 43) Police persons visited a number of houses at Katwa to enforce the standard protocol of complete measures.
- 44) District police arranged foods for street dwellers at Galsi and Memari.
- 45) Maintaining of social distance by marking at different essential food commodities shop & fruits vegetable market at Tentultala Bazar, Station Bazar, Kalna Gate, Bajepratapur, Mondal Bazar, Uttarfatak & Burra Bazar.
- 46) Burdwan Municipality had taken an initiative to provide food for homeless. One NGO named SPEED has volunteered to take the responsibility of the entire

- programme. Daily 120/130 people were being provided with food. It has started from 25.03.2020.
- 47) A 20 bed isolation centre at Memari Stadium was set up by Memari Municipality.
- 48) Hut Management: Distance from shop to shop is at least 10 ft and purchaser is at least 3 ft.
- 49) A tableau with public address system moved through the district from 26.03.2020 to 15.04.2020 and distributed hand bills on COVID 19 awareness.
- 50) Regular health check up of stranded labourers was done and they were provided with cooked food at different schools of Bardhaman.
- 51) 30 inmates were released on parole and 20 persons were released on bail from Bardhaman Correctional Home.
- 52) Bardhaman mini Zoo was thoroughly sanitized and forest department kept strong vigil on the health of the animals.
- 53) Burdwan Municipality is planning to install sanitize gates at the import locations of Burdwan Municipality area.
- 54) Oregram CADC hostel was turned into a 33 bed quarantine centre.
- 55) Psychiatric counselling was done at Krishi Bhavan quarantine centre.
- 56) Some of the stranded labourers, who have completed 14 days of quarantine, have expressed their willingness to work here.
- 57) Entry points of Badulia village of Khandaghosh Block were sealed since a resident of this village was detected as COVID 19 positive. The patient was shifted to COVID 19 hospital in Durgapur.
- 58) A special team was formed by the district police exclusively to reach medicines to the patients at their residential address
- 59) Burdwan Municipality started a free service, medical consultation over phone for residents.
- 60) Street dwellers of Burdwan town were accommodated at the Mati Tirtha Krishi Katha.
- 61) A meeting with Imams regarding maintenance of social distancing during Ramadan was held Burdwan-II Block.
- 62) Drone surveillance was done to prevent unwanted public gathering.
- 63) District Administration planed to set up second quarantine centre at the under construction building of Bidhan Chandra Krishi Vishwavidyalaya, adjacent to the present quarantine centre.
- 64) Making of masks have become a source of livelihood to some of the Self Help Groups.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) of Natural Calamity:

- Day One
 - o Zero Hour→Communicate all concerned related with disaster-- Rapid situation analysis conducted by available means and report prepared.
 - Past Zero Hour→Movement of QRT to the place of incedents—Relief Material to be dispatched to the nearest rescue shelter—Resucue tools and mobilities to be arranged depending upon the nature of incedents— Medical Team to be send to the spot
- Day Two
 - o Engage as many as volunteers needed to assist the affected people
 - Analysize situation and plan accordingly
 - o Stock Taking and requisition relief material & other things
- Day Three to Day Nineth
 - Situationa Analysis
 - Stock taking of mitigation work already done
 - Assessment of requiremet of NDRF/ SDRF, etc.
 - Stock taking of destruction of properties
- Day Nineth plus One
 - Submission of Written reports by all the Stakeholders. The reports shall include a brief regarding their experience, lessons learnt, the problem areas encountered by them and their suggestions for improving the systems.
- Day Nineth plus Two Week
 - o Preparation of Mitigation Plan
 - Start Mitigation work with the help of own resources
 - Send requirement for resources to be required from vertical hierarchy immediately
 - Continue the process still completion
 - Evaluate Disaster Management Plan
 - Update Disaster Management Plan where it requires

SOP for Rail Accident

Definition of Rail Accident situation:

A serious disruption of the railway coaches / rail lines by two trains / train with other vehicles involving widespread human, material loss which exceeds the ability of the affected passengers to cope using its own resources and requires external assistance.

- a) Action on receipt of rail accident: As soon as the rail accident message will be received from the local police station / railway authority / local people at district EOC will be communicated to the local BDO / SDO/ DM and the State EOC.
- b) Proceeds to access technical resources for emergency response: Soon after getting the rail accident information, SDRF / Civil Defence department will be informed by District Disaster Management Section for search and rescue operation. Besides this health Dept.will also be informed to move with medical team & ambulance to the spot.
 - Moreover, District Disaster Management & Civil Defence Secton will be informed by the District Magistrate to depute NDRF / SDRF for immediate action.
- c) Role and responsibility of Stakeholder:
 - i. Railway department will take immediate measures for power cut-off and invite rescue railway van and recovery van. They will arrange for uninterrupted rail service by maintaining all possible measures.

- ii. Search & rescue team: they will start search & rescue operation and bring out the wounded / injured passengers and send to local hospital after first aid treatment by medical doctor.
- iii. Police personnel: They will cordon the area to save luggage / belongings of the passengers form theft / misplaced.
- iv. Transport Department: They will provide quick local transportation support to save life.
- v. Railway Hospital: Injured passengers will be shifted to nearestrailway hospital for treatment.
- vi. Medical Team: Medical Team of both railway / CMOH office / BMOH will check up the injured passengers and arrange to hospitalise them if required to railway / civil hospital / Kolkata.
- d) Medical Management Strategy: The ADM(Disaster Management) in coordination with District Disaster Management Section and line department of the Govt. will arrange to list up the names of the injured / deceased passengers with photograph and arrange to display those in an open space. A temporary control room with phone / mobile numbers will be opened on the spot for early communication with the relatives of the injured / deceased person.
- e) They will also circulate the rail accident through local T.V channels/ Cable T.V. channel and the control room phone / mobile numbers also.
- f) Relief and Rehabilitation Norms:
 - i. Evacuation: Injured / deceased passengers will be evacuated by civil defence / Panchayat/ municipality /DMG / Police etc and will be kept in a temporary built tent / camp for identification and medical treatment. .
 - ii. Search & rescue: It will be done by NDRF/ SDRF / Civil Defence team / police etc.
 - iii. Cordoning the area; Police authorities both RPF/ Civil administrative will cordon the area affected and arrange lightening the spot for rescue operation, if occurs during night to continue rescue operation beyond day light. Aska light of District Disaster Management Section may be used if needed.
 - iv. Traffic Control: Traffic movement / control will be maintained by the local police authority to keep normal life and restore normalcy.
 - v. Law and Order safety measures: It will be monitored and maintained by police authority i.e SDPO/ I.C.
 - vi. Dead body disposal: Persons / Passengers who died will be certified by the medical officer/ doctor and then post mortem arrangement will be made by medial team. The dead body so identified will be handed over the near relatives after maintaining a register by Civil Police / Railway police.

The unidentified dead bodies will be kept in the railway Hospital/ Morgue for somedays and will be arranged for disposal after a fixed time.

- g) Humanitarian Relief and assistance:
 - i) Dry food / cooked food will be provided by local body/BDO/ Railway authority.
 - ii) Drinking water: PHE / local body/BDO/ Railway authority.
 - iii) Medicines: health Department of railway / civil administration/ BPHC/ Sub- Centre will supply emergency medicine.
 - iv) Psycho Social and trauma care : Health Department through BPHC / District Hospital for major accident NIMHANS will assist
 - v) Clothings / Garment / Blanket supply : It will be done by BDO/ Railway authority.
 - vi) Providing Help Line: District EOC/ Railway enquiry number will be provided for getting up-todate information of the rail accident.
 - vii) Management of VIP visit: State Police Department in co-ordination with the District Disaster Management section in consultation with ADM (Disaster management) will arrange the same.
 - viii) Maintenance of record as documentation and financial assistance: The BDMOS / SDDMO will be responsible for keeping record of names of next of kin (s) of the deceased for financial assistance as Ex Gratia Grant by Railway / State Govt. He will provide the detail report to the District Disaster Management Section for submission of the same to the State through ADM/DM and Payment will be made after getting fund after declaration / announced by the State Govt/ Central Govt.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Introduction:

The District Purba Bardhaman is the granary of West Bengal. The district is enriched with the rivers like the Ganges, Ajoy, Damodar, Barakar, Kana Brambhani, Khari, Banka and many other river and riverlets.

The climate of the district is normally moderate. The temperature ranges from 24°C to 44°C in Summer and 6°C to 25°C in Winter. The annual average rainfall of the district is 1300 mm. There are some pockets of the district adjacent to different rivers are vulnerable to flood but the western part is slightly drought prone and susceptible to soil erosion.

There are 3 types of Soil in the district – (i) Gangetic Alluvium – This type of soil is found in this district beside the river Ganges, (ii) Vindhya Alluvium – This alluvium soil is found between the rivers Ajoy and Damodar, (iii) Lateritic Soil – It is found in some parts of Ausgram-I, Ausgram-II Block in the western part of the district which is highly porous, poor in organic matter content and acidic in nature.

The district comprises 3 Agricultural Subdivisions namely Burdwan Sadar, Kalna, Katwa & 4 Administrative Subdivisions namely Burdwan Sadar (North), Burdwan Sadar (South), Kalna, Katwa.

The major crops grown in the District are Aus, Aman, & Boro paddy, Potato, Jute, Mustard, Til, Wheat, Groundnut, Vegetables, Pulses etc.

The District faces both flood and drought & sometimes one is followed by another in the same year. The eastern part of the District has flood prone areas of about 105000 ha. As well as few Blocks have temporary drought prone area, this is about 16470 Ha. The average rainfall of the District for last 10 years is 1209.80 mm., but it is the experience of the people that the District faces scattered & uneven distribution of rainfall almost in every year & the monsoon showers come mostly in late and withdraws in early.

The Disaster Mangement plan in Agriculture sector means the contingent crop planning in Kharif crops during Kharif season to meet up the unforeseen contingencies like flood, drought etc. during the growing season of crops.

Agriculture largely depends on the nature & contingent crop planning is an integral part of agricultural production planning. The objective of the contingency crop planning is to provide ways & means to tackle the situation due to flood or drought or any other natural calamity.

To combat the situation, whatever it may arise due to flood or drought the following action plan may be adopted:

To overcome the adverse effect of Flood

Actions to be taken up by the farmers:

- 1. Staggered sowing of paddy seed bed at 10 days interval for at least 2500 ha.
- 2. A place of higher elevation to be chosen for raised seed bed.
- 3. Cultivation of flood tolerant Swaran Sub-I Variety to be followed.
- 4. To reduce the detrimental effect of sand deposition in cultivated land, sufficient organic matter is to be applied.
- 5. Use of drum seeder in case of late sowing.
- 6. Use of Zero tillage for better result in adverse situations.
- 7. Double transplanting of Paddy will be very much helpful specially after receding flood water during early and mid season flood.
- 8. In case of late transplanting five to six numbers of seeding per hill to be transplanted and basal dose of Nitrogen to be increased.
- 9. Where there is no time for rice cultivation
 - a) Kalai / Arhar may be grown in the post-Kharif season.
 - b) Toria, yellow sarson, lentil, gram, pea, vegetable etc. may be grown early in the Rabi season.

Measures to be taken up by the Agriculture Department:

- 1. Requirement of seed and fertilizer kit submitted to the higher authority to meet up the contingent need during Kharif 2020-2021
- 2. Staggered Seed Bed at Govt. Farm- 1 acre in each Govt farm, Total: 17 Acre
- 3. Storing of straw at Govt. Farm for feeding the cattles 50 MT
- 4. WBSSC District Manager should supply sufficient quantity of seed if required.

To overcome the adverse effects of Drought

Actions to be taken up by the farmers:

- 1. For harvesting rain or runoff water, earthen bunds are to be constructed around the individual plot.
- 2. Application of organic manure to increase the water holding capacity of the soil.
- 3. Staggered sowing of rice seed in seed bed at 10 days interval.
- 4. Cultivation of Sahabhagi variety of paddy may be followed.
- 5. Closer spacing with higher number of seedlings per hill is to be practised.
- 6. Direct seeding of rice through zero tillage machines.
- 7. Cultivation of Arhar, blackgram, groundnut & maize or mixed cropping of maize & arhar in high lands.
- 8. Use of micro-irrigation systems like drip irrigation, sprinkler, rain gun etc. should be popularized.
- 9. Mechanical weeding in rice field & use the uprooted biomass of weeds as soil mulch or use other mulching materials like straw in rice field.
- 10. Not to apply Nitrogenous fertilizer in the soil to restrict weed growth. Foliar spray of Urea or DAP @ 1-2 % may be applied at vegetative growth stage of the crop.

Actions to be taken up by the Agriculture Department:

- 1. Joint monitoring by District level officers of the department of Agriculture, Irrigation & Waterways and WRIDD to be done to look into the real situation and to find out the ways for supplying Irrigation water from all Irrigation sources and ensuring it at grass root level in the blocks.
- 2. Water harvesting structures like pond, dug well etc. to be excavated for storing rain water by the departments.
- 3. Agril Deptt. is trying to popularise micro-irrigation systems like drip irrigation, sprinkler, rain gun etc.
- 4. Huge numbers of pump sets to be provided to the farmers from ongoing Departmental Scheme.
- 5. WBSSC District Manager should supply sufficient quantity of seed if required.

ANIMAL RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (ARD) DEPARTMENT:

Natural Calamities like flood, cyclone and drought are common in West Bengal and are annual feature. There are many districts which are flood prone whereas there are few other districts which are drought prone. Tornado in coastal area and land slides in hilly areas of the state are also not uncommon. Therefore, a detailed work plan /action plan are suggested for combating the natural calamities in the long term interest of Animal Resources Development.

The Action plan may be classified in three phases:-

- A. Preparedness in anticipation.
- B. Immediate Action in face of calamity.
- C. Post Calamity Action.

A. PREPAREDNESS IN ANTICIPATION:


- Advance planning to keep all departmental staff alert before the onset of the season and their subsequent deployment in the eventuality should be through deployment planning and necessary strengthening.
- Arrangement for procurement and storage of essential inputs like medicine, vaccine, feed, fodder, disinfectants, water purifier etc. to save the affected livestock, to be made.
- Director of Agriculture Department/ Deputy Director, Agriculture (Admn.) of the district to be requested to keep the paddy straw in stock for the anticipated calamity.
- ❖ Managing Director of DAIRPOL to be requested to keep reserve the concentrate.
- ❖ Animals in endemic zone, to be vaccinated against different bacterial and viral diseases as the case may warrant, e.g. Anthrax, H.S.,B.Q., P.P.R, Goat Pox,R.D., F.C., F.P., etc.
- ❖ Identification of vulnerable areas and livestock shelters.
- Arrangement to be made for opening control room at District/Sub-Division/Block level and Veterinary team to be kept ready to proceed promptly along with medicines.
- Finalisation of rate for procurement of paddy straw locally by inviting quotation at Block/ District level.
- ❖ District Administrative Authority and Panchayat functionaries at various levels to be contacted in regular manner to have updating information for calamities and guideline to aware the farmers.

B. IMMEDIATE ACTION IN FACE OF CALAMITY:

- > Opening of control room at Block, Sub-Division, Districts and State Level.
- Assessment of need based on requirement of inputs materials (feed & fodder, medicine, vaccine) for affected livestock and communication of the same to the Government.
- ➤ Procurement of feed from DAIRPOL and fodder from Agriculture /local market, medicine and vaccine to be distributed with the help of Block & Panchayat Functionaries.
- > Opening of Animal Health Camps immediately at the affected area near the temporary shelters with medicines & vaccines and assess the loss in respect of ARD.

> Initiation of carcass removal by arrangement with Civil Defence Volunteers / Panchayat Functionaries/ Civil Society Organization.

c. POST CALAMITY ACTION (Delayed Action):

- Animals in endemic zones, to be revaccinated against different bacterial and viral diseases as the case may be, e.g. Anthrax, H.S, B.Q,PPR.Goat Pox,RD, FC, FP etc.
- Care should be taken to combat the post calamity various diseases of livestock which will affect their health and production.
- Economic rehabilitation of affected Livestock farmers may be provided with small units of Poultry, Piggery, Goatery and Dairy etc.
- Model Livestock scheme may be implemented in consultation with Panchayat Functionaries.
